# Wor. Bro. George Washington: When was he REALLY born?

During last month's Table Lodge, our guest presenter, Wor. Jon T. Ruark, highlighted an interesting point regarding the the date of Wor. Bro. George Washington's birth and initiation into the Mysteries of Freemasonry. He was born February 22, 1732, and Initiated at Fredericksburg Lodge #4 on November 4, 1752, according to the Gregorian calendar which we currently use.

Doing the math, does that mean that Bro. George Washington was 20 (not 21) years old when he was Initiated? If so, does that mean that he was not "of lawful age?"

Fear not, brethren. According to the National Archives website (https://www.archives.gov/legislative/features/washington):

"George Washington was born in Virginia on February 11, 1731, according to the then-used Julian calendar. In 1752, however, Britain and all its colonies adopted the Gregorian calendar which moved Washington's birthday a year and 11 days to February 22, 1732."

The difference between the Julian and Gregorian calendars increases by 1 day every leap year. At the time of Bro. Washington's birth, the difference between the two calendars was 1 year and 11 days, hence the date discrepancy. (Source: https://stevemorse.org/jcal/julian.html)

GW born (Julian): GW turns 21 (Julian): Gregorian Calendar Adopted: GW Initiated (Gregorian): February 11, 1731 February 11, 1752 September 14, 1752 November 4, 1752

So by the time Britain and her colonies (including the American colonies) had adopted the Gregorian calendar on September 14, 1752, Bro. Washington had already celebrated his 21st birthday on February 11, 1752 under the Julian calendar. So regardless of which calendar was in operation on the night of Bro. Washington's initiation, he had lived over 21 years on Earth.

#### Ch 2, Sec IV: Concerning the Behavior of Masons in Their Private Character


When not in a formal Lodge: "You are to salute each other in a courteous manner, calling each other Brother, and freely communicating hints of knowledge, but without disclosing secrets unless to those who have given long proof of their taciturnity and honor. In this friendly intercourse, no Brother shall derogate from the respect due to another, were he not a Mason. For though all Masons, as Brothers, are upon the level, yet Masonry divests no man of the honors due to him before, or that may become due after he was made a Mason."

When at Home and in your Neighborhood: "Masons ought to be moral men... they should be good husbands, good parents, good sons, and good neighbors, not staying too long from home, avoiding all excess injurious to themselves or families, and wise as too all affairs, both of their own household and of their Lodge, for certain reasons known to themselves."

Behind a Brother's back as well as before his face: "Free and accepted Masons have ever been charged to avoid all manner of slandering and backbiting of true and faithful Brethren, with all malice and unjust resentment, or talking disrespectfully of a Brother's person or performance. Nor must they suffer any others to spread unjust reproaches or calumnies against a Brother behind his back, nor to injure him in his fortune, occupation, or character; but they shall defend such a Brother, and give him notice of any danger or injury wherewith he may be threatened, to enable him to escape the same, as far as is consistent with honor, prudence, and the safety of religion, morality, and the state, but no further."

<u>To contemplate</u>: This passage outlines two primary teachings for Masons: 1.) how we treat each other, and 2.) how we treat non-Masons. These teachings are summarized by the symbolism of the Plumb, the Level, and the Square, and are reinforced in the Charge given at the closing of every Master Mason lodge. The degree to which we emulate these teachings in our daily lives speaks to our success in our Masonic journey, and strongly influences the non-Masons' views of the Craft.

### LODGE HISTORY

Henry Knox Field Lodge, No. 349, A.F. & A. M., was chartered in the Town of Potomac, Virginia, on February 12, 1925. It was named in honor of Henry Knox Field, a local businessman and community leader from Alexandria, Virginia, who served as Grand Master of Masons in Virginia, in 1917. Most Worshipful Field was raised to the degree of Master Mason on February 20, 1890, at Andrew Jackson Lodge, No. 120, A.F. & A.M. On June 24, 1893, he was installed Worshipful Master of that Lodge. Most Worshipful Field was born on April 20, 1860 and passed away on August 1, 1917, while serving as Grand Master.

John Blair Lodge No. 187, A.F. & A.M., was instituted on July 31, 1970, and chartered at Henry Knox Field Lodge No. 349 on February 10, 1971. The lodge was named in honor of Virginia's first Grand Master and inaugural United States Supreme Court Justice John Blair, Jr. Jewels, aprons, the bible, and tiler's sword were given by Worshipful Raymond L. Colins. The speakers podium for the Lodge was constructed and donated by Right Worshipful Clarence A. Dains. The brazen pillars were constructed and donated by the Charter Treasurer, John Newton Crawford, and the altar cover was later donated by Most Worshipful Werner Herman Morlock, Grand Master of Masons in Virginia in 1993, who died in office on Saturday, March 5, 1994.

The lodges initiated the consolidation process in February 2017, with the Resolution on Consolidation being adopted in June of the same year. Henry Knox Field—John Blair Lodge, No. 349, A.F. & A.M., officially began work January 1, 2018.
